



June 25th, 1967 - All You Need Is Love...

This has been God's cry since the beginning
Paul tells us how important this love – 1 Corinthians 13.1-3
The word Love dominates the Book of First John

Learning About Love From The Pen of John...

Loving others is an old command...

From the beginning - Cain – The Ten Commandments Leviticus 19.18 – Micah 6.8 – From the lips of Jesus - Luke 10.27 God is love – His DNA – His most prominent gene

We are born into God's loving family – Love matures over a lifetime The Godhead makes this a new command by modeling it for us...

John 3.16-17 & 1 John 3.16

Romans 5.8 - God loved us while we were yet undeserving Biblical love is not a feeling – But a behavior...

1 John 4.9 – God showed His love by sending His Son 1 John 3.17-18 – Do not love in word but with action & truth James 2.15-16 gives us the same message

If you love Me - Keep My commandments argues for a behavior Examples of a loving behavior...

The Good Samaritan – Luke 10.25-37

The sheep & goat Judgment - Matthew 25.31-46

Our words are important – But proof is found in our behavior What kind of Gospel are we writing

Agape love is proof of our discipleship...

Agape is a Willful – Decisive – Unconditional – Sacrificial Benevolence without regard for the feelings or behavior of the recipient Agape is placing the interest of others before our own 1 John 4.7-8 – Unless we Agape others - We neither know or love God John 13.35 – All will know you are My disciple – When you Agape When doctrine trumps love – Something is wrong with our doctrine Time to test our love...

1 John 4.20-21 we cannot love God unless we love our brother 1 Corinthians 13.4-8 – Love's Litmus Test

7 Dear friends, I am not writing you a new command but an old one, which you have had since the beginning. This old command is the message you have heard. 8 Yet I am writing you a new command; its truth is seen in him and you, because the darkness is passing and the true light is already shining. 9 Anyone who claims to be in the light but hates his brother is still in the darkness. 10 Whoever loves his brother lives in the light, and there is nothing in him to make him stumble.11 But whoever hates his brother is in the darkness and walks around in the darkness; he does not know where he is go-

ing, because the darkness has blinded him.

1 John 3.11-18

11 This is the message you heard from the beginning: We should love one another. 12 Do not be like Cain, who belonged to the evil one and murdered his brother. And



why did he murder him? Because his own actions were evil and his brother's were righteous. 13 Do not be surprised, my brothers, if the world hates you. 14 We know that we have passed from death to life, because we love our brothers. Anyone who does not love remains in death. 15 Anyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life in him. 16 This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers. 17 If anyone has material possessions and sees his brother in need but has no pity on him, how can the love of God be in him? 18 Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth.

Select Verses From 1 John 4.7-21

7 Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. 8 Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love...11 Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. 12 No-one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us. 13 We know that we live in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit...16 And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in him... 19 We love because he first loved us. 20 If anyone says, "I love God," yet hates his brother, he is a liar. For anyone who does not love his brother, whom he has seen, cannot love God, whom he has not seen. 21 And he has given us this command: Whoever loves God must also love his brother.
